Pavement is broken in places with some gravel encountered. All riders should be self sufficient and comfortable with road and highway riding. High-vis clothing and helmets are required. We will ride southwest and camp overnight Saturday at Lieber State Recreation Area located in Putnam County. There is a \$2.00 daily fee at the park entrance for bicycle travelers. Camping fees will be paid by CIBA and are \$13.26 (non-electric) per site for Saturday night. A site can accommodate no more than 2 tents and 6 people. This is a spring, warm day (we hope) / cool night weather, one-night tour. Riders carry their own riding and camping gear on their bikes. There is no sag vehicle. The terrain will make you wish you had packed lighter!! We'll plan to eat from our packs on the way and to cook in camp Saturday night.
